Pupils will be taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently. They will use a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke & breaststroke). They will perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.	Swimming lessons for all pupils, 1 term per class per year.	£2,173 Transport & Swimming Instructors	All pupils are water confident and able to submerge their face and blow bubbles underwater. The majority of pupils in KS2 are able to swim at least 25 metres. 57% of our Year 6 children can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. 57% can use a range of stroke effectively and 57% can perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations.
Pupils will receive 2 sports sessions per week. In addition, weekly 'Welly Walks' in Class 1, movement breaks for selected/identified children and the chance to attend an after school Football club.	All pupils will receive a minimum of 2 hours sports based activities per week.	£10,916	PE sessions have continued as planned. There have been additional PE sessions as and when curriculum time allows. Both classes have participated in welly walks and rambles in the local area. Movement breaks have continued where needed. Football Club has not taken place.
Pupils receive high quality age appropriate PE sessions which develop skills as expected in the National Curriculum. Expectations for behaviour are consistently applied.	PE sessions are led by a trained PE teacher	£2,180	PE sessions have continued as planned. All children have shown development in both PE skills and knowledge.
To give the whole school the opportunity to participate in school sport within the wider learning community and to experience new sports. PE lead to attend local network meetings.	Funding will enable access to local sports events with the sports leaders at the Secondary School and other schools across the Learning Community.	£970	Wider Opportunities through SASP activities within the wider learning community have taken place over the course of the year for all year groups. Children have also had the opportunity to take part in a Cross Country event. PE lead attending local network meetings have not taken place.
Provide pupils with varied & appropriate sports equipment for PE sessions & break times.	Ensure budget is used to purchase sport equipment.	£100	PE equipment has been restocked as necessary.
